Richard Boukas Bio

Internationally acclaimed guitarist, vocalist, composer, educator and author, he is recognized as a primary exponent and advocate of **Brazilian music**. Leader of original music ensembles for forty-five years and an itinerant solo performer, composer and educator, solo venues include B.B. King's Latin Guitar Festival, Jazz Forum, masterclasses at New York Guitar Seminar (Mannes) and Hudson Jazz Workshop Composer Series.

Since 2008, Boukas is composer-leader of Brazilian jazz ensemble *Quarteto Moderno*, showcasing his compositions across a panorama of authentic genres. Featuring saxophonist *Lucas Pino*, bassist *Gustavo Amarante* and drummer *Maurício Zottarelli*, performances include *Hudson Hall Jazz Festival*, *Lehman College/Johnny Pacheco Latin Jazz Festival*, *Branford Jazz Festival* (CT), *Queens College Year of Brazil* and the *New Americans Program* of *New York Public Library*. The ensemble's featured CD is *Quarteto Moderno/Live! Ao Vivo!* 

In 2016 he formed *Diálogos Duo* with French clarinetist/bass clarinetist *Louis Arques*. The Duo has recorded two CDs: *Choro Tributes* (2020) and *Homages to Brazilian Masters* (2018).

The Duo's **complete repertoire** composed by Boukas is **100 movements** (**9 suites**)- the largest body of contemporary Brazilian music for clarinet (bass clarinet) and guitar worldwide. Each movement is a tribute to an illustrious Brazilian composer/musician. Diálogos has performed at **ClarinetFest** (International Clarinet Association annual convention **2021**, **2019**), American Public Media, Sacred Heart University (CT), New School College of Performing Arts and conducts **university residencies** using their repertoire as primary curriculum.

Diálogos Duo works are receiving international recognition by elite guitarists and clarinetists:

João Luiz (Brasil Guitar Duo): "I am certain that Boukas' present and future works will be a perennial contribution to contemporary clarinet-guitar literature."

Alessandro Carbonare (Grammy-winning Italian clarinetist): "His extensive knowledge of various Brazilian musical styles and great gift for composing now offers us a broader repertoire of tremendous value."

Boukas is also founder and leader of *Trio Brasileiro* (with Amarante and Zottarelli) and *Duo Brasileiro* (with Amarante). Their repertoire features original compositions, classics from the **Brazilian Songbook** (MPB) and the rich solo Brazilian guitar tradition from *Garôto* to *Guinga*.

Richard's prior **Duo collaborations** feature pianist-composer **Jovino Santos Neto** (formerly of *Hermeto Pascoal Group* (CD *Balaio*) and Croatian tambura virtuoso **Filip Novosel** (CD/DVD *Live at St. Micheal's*).

Richard's other **recordings as leader** include *Amazôna*, *Embarcadero and Commitment*, and produced/arranged *Tudo de Bom*, featuring Hermeto Pascoal's *Calendário do Som*. He is also featured vocalist-percussionist, composer-arranger with **Panamericana Big Band** (directed by Gary Morgan) since 2008.

Richard Boukas Bio p.2

A heralded faculty member at New York City's New School University College of Performing Arts/School of Jazz since 1995 and former faculty at Mannes College and William Paterson University, he founded and directed the Brazilian Jazz and Brazilian Choro Ensembles- producing, arranging and directing landmark programs including tributes to Jacob do Bandolim, Pixinguinha, Hermeto Pascoal, Ernesto Nazareth and music of Minas Gerais.

In 2010 he received the prestigious *New School University Distinguished Teaching Award*, and in 2011 was faculty representative at the *IASJ Convention* (International Association for Jazz Schools) in São Paulo, Brazil. In fall 2015, he joined the faculty at *New York Jazz Workshop*.

A four-time recipient of the **NEA Grant in Jazz Performance**, his many guest artist residencies and masterclasses include Harvard, Cornell, New York Guitar Seminar, National Guitar Workshop. Lamont School of Music/Denver, Hudson Jazz Workshop (NY), New York City Classical Guitar Society, Cincinnati Conservatory, Univ. Louisville, Univ. Arizona/Tucson and Univ. Toronto.

His first extended stay in Brazil was 1998 as guest artist-professor at **Campos do Jordão Festival do Inverno** (São Paulo state). More recent educational activities include: *Federal Univ. Minas Gerais (UFMG, Belo Horizonte)*, *Federal Institute of Pernambuco (Recife)* and panelista-presenter at *Congresso música criativa / Savassi Festival (UniRio, Rio de Janeiro)*.

A prolific composer, Richard holds an MA in Composition from Queens College/Aaron Copland School of Music, for which he presented his thesis on the music of Hermeto Pascoal. Aside from his diverse Brazilian jazz and Diálogos Duo repertoire, he has fulfilled numerous chamber music commissions for ensembles including:

Sopros de PE (clarinet quartet, Recife, Brazil), La Catrina String Quartet, PUBLIQuartet, World String Orchestra of Berklee College, Modern Mandolin Quartet, Atlantic Brass Quintet, Lamont Saxophone Quartet, Queens College Vocal Ensemble and Panamericana Big Band.

Boukas has also created numerous Brazilian choral arrangements featuring the music of Milton Nascimento, Sérgio Santos, Guinga, Radamés Gnattali and Ernesto Nazareth, twenty Beatles Motets (performed by Cerddorion Vocal Ensemble) and composed an extensive body of solo Brazilian guitar music including Guinga Suite.

Apart from his own creative and academic work, Richard is a veteran Broadway and studio musician/producer and endorsing artist with LaBella Strings since 1978. He is also a composer and ensemble member (Diálogos Duo) of Chamber Music America.
